## THE EDITORIAL

The first editor of our church was undoubtedly our first pastor at one of the first meetings during February, 1850, when our pastor was present.

The editor was then sent to the world the best of the old men, venerable, experienced Dr. Old, and successor, professor David Brown, was a son of that famous "General Job" that has given the name many men of note birth. He was a graduate of Boston University and before his election to the church was known throughout New England and to Boston, the far north to this meeting here, from 1850 to 1851. He was not only a teacher of the best, but he was a minister remarkable full of life, and had an easy, free, commanding presence. Professor Brown, who died in 1890, was the father of the author of this article, the well known "Walter" of Boston.

Dr. James A. Weston, D. D., was one of the most distinguished preachers the Congregational ever had on the scene. He was one of the most noted when chosen to be the first president of Randolph-Macon College, and a lasting impression on all who met him, especially on the young men who were over his pastorate. He reached him in middle life of the students and teachers. He was born in 1814, in the city of Boston, and died in 1877 with reputation of New England's preacher. He was in the 1830's one of the great names and was given the title the "Lion of the City." Among other his later work to teach the young men in the college, and the Church, was teaching our four sons to continue in the Master after his father and when called him to his eternal reward. His son, James A. Weston, Dr. J. Weston, was the author, whose father he left a number of papers printed of his service.

George Weston, M. D., was born in Boston. The wife his father was present at the old baptism. When George, when very young, died, the date of his birth was given as the day before his death at the General Hospital of Boston. Dr. J. Weston, himself, in Boston was his son in the following year, yet the date of his birth is unknown to many members of the New England congregation and members of Weston's pastorate, as it was given over the Weston's baptismal record. He is buried in Boston, 1877, 1878.

Most notable pastor, Dr. J. Weston, was the son of George A. Weston, Jr., and has for a number of years past served as the pastor pastor in Franklin Methodist, Boston, Boston, Boston, and the New England, Boston, etc., where he was head of the New England church that pastored in this city. His pastorate in Franklin, Boston, of the time of the death of his son, is still unrecorded.

David Duncan 1<sup>st</sup> was born 1752 in Carrickfordon, Scotland. His mother was a miss Wallace; her mother a Butler and her mother a Cunningham. He married Mary Groves. The Duncan left Scotland and went to Ireland in the reign of James the 1<sup>st</sup> at the time of the invasion and were given grants of land in Ireland by the King to encourage the settlement of the Scotch there. They were known as "The landed Gentry".

The Duncans were owners of large cotton and linen mills in Londonderry, Armagh, and Belfast.

David Duncan 1<sup>st</sup> and Mary Groves had four children of whom I know. They were - David Duncan 2<sup>d</sup>, James Duncan, Rebecca Duncan and Margaret Duncan. Rebecca married a Mitchell. I have photos of her two sons. Her daughter married Sir Peter Lumsden.

David Garrison

David Garrison was born 1797  
in County Donegal, Ireland, and  
died 1871 at Abingdon, S. L., Va.  
The record on the Thorntons says  
that he graduated from Princeton  
University, but there is a question as to whether  
it was Rutgers or Edinburgh.

He came to America in 1817 and  
was principal of the Norfolk Academy  
seventeen years. He  
was elected to the school of ancient  
languages at Randolph-Macon  
College Va. where he taught for 18 years.  
He was there engaged in editing publications

in Wofford College, Abingdon, Va. where it was  
organized 1794 and he taught there 17 years the  
rest of his life. He was twice married; first to a  
Miss Shirley who died only a short while. His  
second marriage wife was Anna Maria Remond of

Before coming to America, Garrison taught for  
over four years in the British Navy, being  
commissioned by the King of Eng. as master of  
convictual discipline in the Baltic and Norey  
ports and Portsmouth. The children of David Garrison  
and Anna Remond were - Mary Elizabeth Garrison;  
David Remond Garrison; James Hutchinson Garrison;  
William Muller Garrison and Thomas Hutchinson  
and George Paul Garrison, brother which died quite  
young. James Hutchinson Garrison was the head of Hennings  
Harrison, Muller & Garrison, his father once taught, and was a  
noted Methodist minister & writer. William Muller Garrison  
is a Bishop of the Methodist Church quite.  
George Lucy Garrison was killed in the Civil war  
and his widow at pottery road, Lancaster, David Garrison  
& Henry fresh were both buried in Abingdon.

David Garrison and his wife are buried  
in the old cemetery near the R.R. station at  
Abingdon with Caroline. There were also  
another daughter, Amanda who died in childhood.

This son was Sheriff of Essex in 1724 + 1725, + Clerk of Caroline from 1726 to 1763. He married Sarah King. They had Rev. Wm. Robinson (Commissary) - who married Miss Neebler and had Benjamin Robinson<sup>2d.</sup> who married Hannah Churchill.

## HISTORY OF YOUR NAME

### LOMAX

The Rev. John Lomax, who was born in England, in 1617, was the founder of this family. At least the pedigree of the American Lomaxes all goes to start with him. His birthplace does not seem to be known, but it is known that he died at North Shields, England, in 1684. His wife was Catherine Gray Lomax. One of their sons was John Lomax, who married Elizabeth Worsley, and they apparently came to Virginia. Their son, Lazarus Lomax, married Judith Miscoe and was the father of Major Thomas Lomax, who married Ann Corbin Taylor. Their home was at Port Tobacco, Charles County, Virginia, and he was born in 1731; their son, John Taylor Lomax, who became an eminent jurist. His wife was Charlotte Thornton. He was for many years professor of law at the University of Virginia and the author of many valuable books on legal subjects.

Another distinguished member of this family was Thomas Lomax, born in Abbeville district, South Carolina, in 1752, the son of William and Elizabeth Tenant Lomax. His mother's ancestry was as interesting as that on the Lomax side of the family. Tenant Lomax's maternal grandparents were W. P. and Martha Middleton Tenant, and he was descended from the Rev. William Tenney, founder of the famous old Log College that ultimately expanded into the Princeton Theological Seminary. Tenant Tenney married Sophie Sherrill of Alabama, and after her death Mrs. Carrie E. Sherrill, Tenant Lomax, was a soldier, becoming colonel in the Confederate army.

Lansford Lindsey Lomax, born in Newport in 1822, was a soldier of note. He was the son of Major Mann Page and Elizabeth Lindsey Lomax, a grandson of Captain William Lindsey, of Lord Lindsey in the Revolution, and a descendant of Sir Thomas Lindsey. Lansford Lindsey Lomax was a soldier in the Confederate army, becoming assistant adjutant general to General J. E. Johnston.

William Lomax<sup>1<sup>st</sup></sup> was the first of our Lomax ancestors to come to America. He was born in England in 1700. He married Anne Coxe, daughter of Dr. John Coxe of Dublin Ireland. She was a widow Donnelly when he married her. Wm. Lomax was destined to enter the priesthood of the Church of England, and was first sent to Oxford, and thence to a divinity school. He was given a parish and preached one sermon. He became infected with the deistical views so prevalent in that age & abandoned the ministry & went to London & bound himself to a builder & architect. After serving seven years he was sent to America to build a church on the grant of Lord Baltimore or Lord Raleigh. He settled in Rockingham Co. N.C. In leaving the ministry he gave up a life of ease with hope of a brilliant future for which he was eminently fitted by education & talent. He was a fine scholar & a first class mechanician. He brought from Eng. a fine library and his wife, Anne Coxe also brought a like library from Dublin. The children of Wm. Lomax & Anne Coxe were —

Lomax were manifested in their children and descendants for generations who were generally well read in history, geography and philosophy. Mr. Joseph Lomax, a great grandson of Anne Coke + W<sup>m</sup>. Lomax has written a history of the Lomax family. He lived in Indianapolis Ind. and my brother Matt Jones was invited to his 95<sup>th</sup> birthday dinner in 1904.

Lomax was born in Rockingham Co. N.C.

1745: He married Jane Dilworth of Rockingham where they lived for awhile. They moved to Abbeville S.C. and the site of the old Lomax homestead is about ten miles from Abbeville Courthouse. The Lomax cemetery is near the homestead. It is enclosed by a rock wall + there James Lomax, Jr. and his first wife, Jane Dilworth, are buried. Also three of their children + some relatives. A few shrubs + some debris mark the site of the dwelling house.

Being too far from a place of worship to attend, James + his brother Terence built this "Lomax Chapel" of hewn logs.

The last preaching was by a Methodist preacher in 1820. James Lomax willed the plantation to his second wife, Lucy, and she having no children, willed it to Dr. Warren George Lomax, her husband's grandson. The Lomax place is now owned by Andrew Stephenson. James Lomax, Jr. died Aug. 9th. 1835 in the 80th year of his life.

of the time Speaker of the House. He  
was elected to Congress at one time

The name Lomax was foreign when it first appeared in England. Tradition, as handed down from generation to generation, is that they were Huguenots, and fled from France to England to escape Roman Catholic persecution. The French form of the name was Le Meaux. The first English Lomax of whom we have account bore the French Christian name of Laurent. Laurent Lomax of Bolton Parish, Lancaster Eng. born about 1427, seems to be the ancestor of all the English and American Lomaxes. His son, Laurent, (note change of u to eng. w) of Eye in Suffolk acquired in 1494 a coat of arms, the motto being "Mors Christi Vita Mihi." This indicated that they were decidedly a Christian people at that early day. It is probable that the Lomax family came originally into France from Lombardy in Italy the Italian name being Lomazzo. Lomax is thought by Latin scholars to be a contraction of Leo and Maximus, "the greatest lion". The French, and still more the Italian origin of the family indicates that they were a more considerable people, & more highly educated and refined than the common English people. At this time (1494) the French were more highly cultivated than the English, and the Italians the most highly learned people in Europe.

## Pon.

The name Pon, also the family, is Spanish in origin, and means a source of drinking water - thus a spring or well. The coat of arms is a curved well (dark red) with black equipments - a green lizard on each side facing each other with gesture of climbing and tails passing in front of well. All is on a golden field.

The following manuscript (written in Spanish, but translated here) is attached to the Pon coat of arms on view at the Public Library, 42<sup>nd</sup> St. + 5<sup>th</sup> Ave. New York City, and at the Hispanic Museum New York City. It was written by the Spanish historian Ponier.

### Translation.

\*The Pon lineage, coming from Catalonia, is very illustrious and known to that province, and as ancient as the Catalan tongue in which the word Pon means a "well" (the noun well a source of drinking water). From there have come very numerous families of this surname who have spread in almost all the provinces of Spain and

in the New World. Their sons have attained everywhere honorable offices, political, civil, military, parochial, and ecclesiastical. One of these illustrious families established itself in the Balearic Islands when King Alonso III of Aragon conquered King Jaume II in 1285 on the island of Mallorca. Pedro Pou was one of the guards who defended the castle of Alaior.

Bartolome Pou noted theologian. He was in 1363 coates (senate and congress of deputies of Spain) summoned by King Pedro the IV of Aragon as representative of the principal state of Majorca.

Don Leonardo Pou was one of the captains who in the time of Filipe the II fought in the wars of Catalonia.

Don James Pou of Bernad, doctor of both laws, wise and virtuous man, and exemplary priest, was judge of the tribune of Rota for the crown of Aragon, Canon of the Holy Roman church of Palma, Archbishop of Bari, prefect of clementam, protector of Poland, and cardinal of the Holy Roman church called Santa Maria in via lata to the celebrated council that met at Trent. He was one of the legates of His Holiness. The Cardinal of Santa Flora.

tried several times to have him elected Pope, but one doctor terminally opposed such exalted promotion in spite of the fact, that accepting the tiara, he would have acceded to the wishes of many European princes. He died in Rome April 26<sup>th</sup>. 1563

Don Martin Pou, in 1708, was juez of the city and kingdom of Majorca.

Father Bartolome Pou, jesuit, gifted with rare talents, extraordinary memory of great penetration and perspicacity, and untiring application to study, shone in the sciences, excelling chiefly in Latin + Greek tongues, and philosophy and theology. He was poor, most moderate in his habits and very candid. This worthy (so) eminent sage died April 17<sup>th</sup> 1802.
